The City of Babylon: "the gate of the gods"

A. A 'tale of two cities' – Chps 17-22 is consumed with these two

<u>New Jerusalem</u>
Built by Christ (Jn 14:2-3)
Heavenly city (21:1-2a)
"Having the glory of God" (21:11)
Pictured: <i>a virgin bride</i> (21:2b)
Holy and pure (21:27; 22:14-15)
Eternal – lasts forever (22:50
Inhabitants: dwell secure (21:3-4)

- (1) 17:1-6 Vision of Babylon
- (2) 17:7-18 Interpretation of the vision
- (3) 18:1-8 **P**hysical destruction of the city
- (4) 18:9-20 Laments of the world over the loss of the city
- (5) 18:21-24 **D**ivine reason for the judgment

C. Outline of 17:1-6 – *The Vision of Babylon*

- vv 1-2 *Invitation* to John to "Come and see"
- vv 3-6 <u>Dramatization</u> of historic significance taking the reader back to Rev 6:1 and the 1 seal which opens the Tribulation Period
- (1) v 1a Her Judgment declared
 - Note: 17:18; 18:21-24
- (2) vv 1b-2 *Her Image*
 - a. A great harlot [spiritual adultery] who sits on the waters see v 15
 - b. The world is intoxicated with her verse 2
- (3) v 3 Her Alliance (John is captured by her not the Beast)
 - a. The woman and the beast are distinct
 - i. <u>Beast</u> Antichrist [note 13:1]
 - ii. <u>*Harlot*</u> represents false religion (apostate one-world church)
 - b. The Beast forms a short-lived alliance with her
 - Both are "scarlet" Beast is masked by her
 - c. It looks like the woman is in control
 - d. The Beast seems tame and docile (unlike 13:1ff)

e. The harlot is used by Antichrist for the first 3¹/₂ years of the Tribulation (17:16-17 with Daniel 9:27a). She is what makes the city of Babylon what it is, but Antichrist (in middle of Trib) desires worship – 13:8

(4) v 4a – *Her Dress*

• She is successful and rich (see 18:3 and 7)

(5) v 4b – *Her Practice*

- She is full of spiritual adultery one-world religion
- (6) v 5 *Her Name*
 - a. "mystery" Not part of her name, but the mystery is that the city of Babylon resurfaces as a literal city and is rebuilt as the capital of Antichrist's world rule
 - b. OT begins with city of Babel "he confused" Gen 11
 - c. OT ends with prophecy of Babylon Zech 5:5-11
 - d. Middle of OT Isaiah's incredible prophecy –13-14
- (7) v 6 Her Persecution (blood-thirsty, hates God/His people)

D. Fitting the Rest of Chapters 17-18 around the Vision

(1) 17:7-18 – Interpretation of the Vision

We learn four things in this interpretation

- a. Though the Vision is consumed with the Harlot, the interpretation is consumed with the Beast and His city
- b. The Beast will have absolute control in the final 42 months of history before Christ returns (cf. 13:16-18)
- c. There are no laments in ch 17 at the death of the harlot
- d. Harlot image remains firm over the city 17:18; 19:2
- (2) 18:1-8 *Physical Destruction of the City*
 - a. By the middle of the Tribulation Period this city has become a political and economic powerhouse 18:3,7
 - b. Nothing humanly can stop this 'throne of Antichrist'
 - c. Verse 5 a play on 'Babel's' earliest days in Gen 11
 - d. Verse 8 God is strong who judged her
 - e. <u>*Question:*</u> When God destroys city, why is not the Antichrist destroyed since this is his capital? 16:10-21
- (3) 18:9-20 Laments of the world . . . singing in Heaven?
 - a. vv 9-19 The Laments
 - b. v 20 Singing in Heaven . . . see 19:1-3
- (4) 18:21-24 *Divine reason for the judgment*
- E. Three Sharp Conclusions: To remind, To warn, To awake! (1) I Timothy 4:1 (2) I John 2:18-19 (3) Matthew 7:21-27
