How to Effectively Pray for the Church Elders

A. The passages which control my personal thinking

- 1. <u>Acts 20:28</u> "...the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God..."
- 2. <u>Ephesians 4:7-14</u> "Christ...gave you to the church...for the equipping of the saints for ministry . . . to a perfect man . . ."
- 3. <u>*I Timothy 5:17-20*</u> "...rule well...those [*elders*] who are sinning rebuke in the presence of all..."
- 4. <u>*I Peter 5:1-4*</u> "...being examples to the flock...you will receive a crown of glory..."
- 5. <u>*Titus 1:6-9*</u> 15 qualifications of character and integrity
- B. Will YOU pray with me through these 15 qualifications?
 - **v.** <u>6</u> 1. "blameless" To live above *fleshly accusations*
 - 2. "husband of one wife" To be devoted to his wife (adore her)
 - 3. "having faithful children" What does this mean?
 - (a) To have all his children be *believers in Christ* ... or
 - (b) To have all his children be <u>faithful</u>... "not accused of dissipation [wild living] or insubordination"
 - <u>v. 7</u> 4. "**not** self-willed" To <u>not</u> be arrogant, or despise higher authorities, or be fully bent on one's own opinion (II Pe. 2:10)
 - 5. "**not** quick tempered" To <u>not</u> be fast to anger, or contentious
 - 6. "**not** given to wine" To <u>not</u> be known as a pleasure drinker
 - Paul used "wine" 5xs in 13 books all with a caution
 - 7. "not violent" To not be a bully or an intimidator (*pugnacious*)
 - <u>Spurgeon</u>: "Don't go about the world with your fist doubled up for fighting, carrying a theological revolver in the leg of your trousers."
 - 8. "**not** greedy for money" To <u>not</u> be motivated by money/greed
 - He is completely satisfied with God's gifts in his life
 - <u>v. 8</u> 9. "hospitable" To have a home which is open to assist others
 - 10. "a lover of what is good" To have a passion for the best things in life which have eternal value – Philippians 1:9-11
 - 11. "sober-minded" To exercise wisdom in all decisions and be balanced in his approach to life and ministry (Note: 2:6)
 - 12. "just" To be upright; in I Jn 3:7 'one who does righteousness'
 - 13. "holy" To be pleasing to God in mind, body, and spirit
 - 14. "self-controlled" To be disciplined like an athlete I Cor 9:25
 - There is no room for self-indulgence with this word
 - v. 9 15. "holding fast the faithful word as he has been taught" To be faithful to the Word of God as he was taught (see: vv 10-16)
