

  - The words *rule* and *subdue* are unique to mankind.


# The Tell el Fakhariyeh Statue and Inscription

#### Gardens as Sacred Space


Garden of Assyrian King Sargon II (721-705 BC)



Ivory Assyrian Relief from 13<sup>th</sup> century B.C.




Features of the Sanctuary	Garden of Eden	Tabernacle/Temple
Entered from the east	And the LORD God planted a garden in Eden, in the east, and there he put the man whom he had formed. (Gen 2:8); He drove out the man, and at the east of the garden of Eden he placed the cherubim and a flaming sword that turned every way to guard the way to the tree of life (Gen 3:24)	Those were to camp before the tabernacle on the east, before the tent of meeting toward the sunrise, were Moses and Aaron and his sons, guarding the sanctuary itself, to protect the people of Israel. (Num 3:38); He set up the pillars in front of the temple, one on the south, the other on the north; that on the south he called Jachin, and that on the north Boaz. (2 Chr 3:17)



five golden pillars (Ex. 26:36-37).

Features of the Sanctuary	Garden of Eden	Tabernacle/Temple
Guarded by cherubim	You were an <u>anointed</u> <u>guardian cherub</u> . I placed you; you were on the holy mountain of God; in the midst of the stones of fire you walked (Ezek 28:14); He drove out the man, and at the east of the garden of Eden he placed the cherubim and a flaming sword that turned every way to guard the way to the tree of life (Gen 3:24)	Moreover, you shall make the tabernacle with cherubim skillfully worked into them.  (Exod 26:1); In the inner sanctuary he made two cherubim of olivewood, each ten cubits high (1 Kgs 6:23); Around all the walls of the house he carved engraved figures of cherubim and palm trees and open flowers, in the inner and outer rooms (1 Kgs 6:29)

Features of the Sanctuary	Garden of Eden	Tabernacle/Temple
The Lord "walks about"	They heard the sound of the LORD God <u>walking about</u> in the garden in the cool of the day (Gen 3:8)	The LORD your God walks in the midst of your camp (Deut 23:14); I have not lived in a house since the day I brought up the people of Israel from Egypt to this day, but I have been moving about in a tent for my dwelling. (2 Sam 7:6)

Features of the Sanctuary	Garden of Eden	Tabernacle/Temple
Tree of Life in its midst	The <u>tree of life</u> was in the midst of the garden (Gen 2:9)	You shall make a <u>lampstand</u> of pure gold. (Exod 25:31)
Tree of the Knowledge of	The tree of life was in the midst of the garden, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil (Gen 2:9); The woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, (Gen 3:6)	The Law is <u>good</u> , <u>delightful</u> ,

Features of the Sanctuary	Garden of Eden	Tabernacle/Temple
God's representative is to "serve" and to "keep/guard"	The LORD God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden <u>to work</u> it and keep it. (Gen 2:15)	They shall keep guard over him and over the whole congregation before the tent of meeting, as they minister at the tabernacle (Num 3:7)

Features of the Sanctuary	Garden of Eden	Tabernacle/Temple
Sweet, life-giving water flows out from it	A <u>river flowed out of Eden</u> to water the garden, and there it divided and became four rivers (Gen 2:10)	There is a <u>river whose streams</u> <u>make glad</u> the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High (Ps 46:4); He brought me back to the door of the temple, and behold, <u>water was issuing</u> from below the threshold of the temple toward the east (for the temple faced east) (Ezek 47:1)

#### Eden as Sanctuary: Pure Streams from the Mountain of God



Features of the Sanctuary	Garden of Eden	Tabernacle/Temple
Gold is plentiful and pure	The <u>gold of that land is</u> <u>good</u> (Gen 2:12)	You shall overlay it with pure gold (Exod 25:11); Solomon overlaid the inside of the house with pure gold (1 Kgs 6:21)

Features of the Sanctuary	Garden of Eden	Tabernacle/Temple
Sacred jewels adorn it	Bdellium and onyx stone are there (Gen 2:12); You were in Eden, the garden of God; every precious stone was your covering, sardius, topaz, and diamond, beryl, onyx, and jasper, sapphire, emerald, and carbuncle; and crafted in gold were your settings and your engravings. (Ezek 28:13)	You shall set in it four rows of stones: sardius, topaz, and carbuncle; an emerald, a sapphire, and a diamond; a jacinth, an agate, and an amethyst; a beryl, an onyx, and a jasper (Exod 28:17-20)

### Eden as Sanctuary: Sacred Jewels on the Priestly Garments



Features of the Sanctuary	Garden of Eden	Tabernacle/Temple
High in elevation (sacred mountain)	A river <u>flowed out of</u> <u>Eden</u> to water the garden (Gen 2:10); You were on <u>the holy</u> mountain of God (Ezek 28:14)	Solomon began to build the house of the LORD in Jerusalem on <u>Mount</u> <u>Moriah</u> (2 Chr 3:1); I have set my King on Zion, <u>my holy hill</u> (Ps 2:6)

Features of the Sanctuary	Garden of Eden	Tabernacle/Temple
Resting place for God	God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it <u>God rested from all his work</u> that he had done in creation (Gen 2:3)	Son of man, this is the place of my throne and the place of the soles of my feet, where I will dwell in the midst of the people of Israel forever (Ezek 43:7); King David rose to his feet and said: "I had it in my heart to build a house of rest for the ark of the covenant of the LORD and for the footstool of our God" (1 Chr 28:2)

Features of the Kingdom	Garden of Eden	Kingdom of Israel
Dominion	God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it, and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth" (Gen 1:28); You have given him dominion over the works of your hands (Ps 8:6)	[Solomon] had dominion over all the region west of the Euphrates from Tiphsah to Gaza, over all the kings west of the Euphrates. And he had peace on all sides around him (1 Kgs 4:24); May he have dominion from sea to sea (Ps 72:8)

Features of the Kingdom	Garden of Eden	Kingdom of Israel
Sonship of Regents	God created man in his own image (Gen 1:27); When Adam had lived 130 years, he fathered a son in his own likeness, after his image, and named him Seth (Gen 5:3); Seth was the son of Adam. Adam was the son of God. (Luke 3:38)	The LORD said to me, "You are my Son; today I have begotten you" (Ps 2:7); He shall cry to me, 'You are my Father, my God, and the Rock of my salvation.' And I will make him the firstborn, the highest of the kings of the earth (Ps 89:26-27)

Features of the Kingdom	Garden of Eden	Kingdom of Israel
Crown	You have <u>crowned</u> him with glory and honor (Ps 8:5)	LORD, in your strength the king rejoices You set a <u>crown</u> of fine gold upon his head (Ps 21:1, 3)
Land	God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and <u>fill the earth</u> " (Gen 1:28)	Ask of me, and I will make the nations your heritage, and the ends of the earth your possession (Ps 2:8)

Features of the Kingdom	Garden of Eden	Kingdom of Israel
Seed	God said to them, " <u>Be</u> <u>fruitful and multiply</u> and fill the earth" (Gen 1:28)	I will <u>establish his</u> <u>offspring</u> forever and his throne as the days of the heavens (Ps 89:29); <u>His</u> <u>offspring shall endure</u> forever, his throne as long as the sun before m (Ps 89:36)

Features of the Kingdom	Garden of Eden	Kingdom of Israel
Blessing	God <u>blessed</u> them. (Gen 1:28)	For you, O Lord GOD, have spoken, and with your <u>blessing</u> shall the house of your servant <u>be blessed forever</u> (2 Sam 7:29)

Features of the Kingdom	Garden of Eden	Kingdom of Israel
Rest	day and made it holy,	The king lived in his house and the LORD had given him rest from all his surrounding enemies (2 Sam 7:1); Now the LORD my God has given me rest on every side (1 Kgs 5:4)
